TEAM ROUNDUP

U6's have good numbers again this year and started off the year with a match against BallyCallan, they then played in the Kells blitz. Next up was Tullogher away and Bennettsbridge away where they continued to improve.

U8's have improve immensely this year with lifting and striking out of hand a common feature. They Played Danesfort in their first game of the year. Their major outing was in the St.Kiernans college blitz where they played Gowran, Slieverue and Bally hale shamrocks. They then played Piltown as part of their fun day and played neighbours Carrickshock. They then played Tullogher and Bennettsbridge, performing very well on all occasions.

U10's & Community games - Working from a small panel our U10's have put in some fine displays and have really benefited from structured fixtures in the "GO Games" set up. They have played James Stephens, BallyCallan, Danesfort, Dicksboro and Carrickshock to name but a few. Their schedule had to be flexible as 5 of the team were involved in the community games team that were beaten in the leinster final against Birr.

U12's hurling training has resumed after the end of the schools hurling league where the school had some good performance in Roinn B having won Roinn C last year. Training resumed in the last few weeks after the Aghervillar community games team's run came to an end. That team had five Dunnmaggin players on it Joe Fitzpatrick, Jimmy O'Neill, Ruairai Holden, Aaron Moore and Tom Lodge. The U12's now have a schedule of games in place in the coming weeks in preparation for the Go Games which will commence in August.

U14's The U14 team have performed exceptionally well in Roinn A Tier 2. They were undefeated and topped the table winning all but one of their games which they drew. They were defeated by O'Loughlins in the championship proper and now are preparing for a 1st round championship encounter against Glenmore.

U16's team have had impressive wins against Clara, Young Irelands and St.Martins with scores very close on all occasions. This set them up in a play off for top of table position against Clara. They play James Stephens B in their preliminary round games in the championship on 13th August.

Minors - Our Minor hurlers, now hurling in Roinn B having won the Roinn C championship last year are doing exceptionally well in their league. They have won three out of four games they have played so far. They play Emeralds in the first round of the championship in September.

Junior Our Junior hurlers are leading the way with some impressive results and displays in their league. Younger players have certainly stepped up a level and are reinvigorating this team.

Intermediate hurlers are still searching for their first league win. After a defeat to last years Co.finalists Emeralds in the first league games narrow defeats to Mullinvatt and St.Lachtains followed despite improved performances on both occasions. Ballycallan and Lisdowney are next up. There has been some high scoring and good performances in the Aylward cup games to date.

Senior Football The footballers had a good start to the year winning two from three league games so far and then doing very well in the championship. They beat O'Loughlins in the first round of the championship to advance to the quarter finals where they beat Conahy Shamrocks to put them in a Semi final against Railyard which they lost by the slimmest margins.
